EDITORS NOTE: *Graphic content / Britain, France, Germany, the US and NATO all voiced horror at Ukrainian reports on April 2, 2022, of nearly 300 bodies lying in the street in Bucha, with some appearing to have been bound by their hands and feet before being shot.*

The Kremlin on April 4, 2022 rejected accusations that Russian forces were responsible for killing civilians near Kyiv. "We categorically reject all allegations," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told journalists.
