On the occasion of the Death of Ms. Ngo Dinh Nhu (Tran Le Xuan) April 24, 2011 Huynh Quoc Binh



After the events of November 1, 1963, although Ms. Ngo Dinh Nhu turned down the press interview with the humble saying that "my time has passed" and remained silent for nearly half a century, the Vcs and the Vietnamese people still won't forgive. Of course the crooks never wear hats or beards to curse her, but they are clever in the guise of religion, intellectuals, or victims of the "nepotism" to insult the woman. this weakness.

Therefore, writing about Ngo Dinh Nhu is very difficult. It is difficult because if anyone dares to speak up the righteous voice, the Vc and the crook will use all kinds of cruel words to attack people. Anyone who associates with the Vcs and the Viets to swear at Ms Nhu is fine, but mentioning her with respect would naturally touch her enemies.

Vietnamese culture teaches the Vietnamese people that "all righteousness, righteousness", but, after Mrs. Nhu's death, I see that crooks still do not forgive the dead. They continue to have posts that offend the deceased. I found myself unable to keep my silent attitude to be alone. I decided to write a few comments on her, as a way of repaying an anti-communist National.

I have a perennial friend whom I have known since 1982 in the United States. He had time to work for the American Embassy in Saigon. He is fluent in many languages, especially English and French. He told me that Mrs. Ngo Dinh Nhu is very brave when responding and responding to the US and foreigners. And he concluded that: "For me, Mrs. Nhu was a very smart, rare Vietnamese woman at the time ..."

When President Ngo Dinh Diem was murdered, I was only ten years old. However, I still remember the image of adults cheering because they were happy to overthrow the "dictatorship - family rule", even though not long ago, the rice of the Government of the Republic of Vietnam was still stuck between their teeth.

I also heard people who called themselves "intellectuals" saying: "The Revolutionary Army and Military Council had merit to overthrow the dictatorial regime of Ngo Dinh Diem". They said that thanks to the overthrow of the two brothers Diem - Nhu, they had discovered many secrets in the Independence Palace. What is the secret tunnel from Independence Palace leading to Thong Nhat Boulevard, and further away is the Father Tam Church, nearly ten kilometers from Independence Palace.

In the past, because I was young, I foolishly believed it to be true. Later when I grew up to learn more, I realized that it was not just me, but even many adults were confused about Vc's tricky propaganda.

In my opinion, from the facts of both sides of love and hatred, Mrs. Ngo Dinh Nhu was a special Vietnamese woman of the late 50s and early 60s.

Instead of calling her a Representative Tran Le Xuan, they called her Counselor Ngo Dinh Nhu. Particularly, the criminals and the Vietnamese "labeling" her in a portable way to deliberately trivialize her, through the title "first lady". Many people identify themselves as National but do not recognize it, so they call her "the first lady."

In the time of the so-called "1-11-63 Revolution" really the name and image of Mrs. Ngo Dinh Nhu are mentioned more than Mr. Ngo Dinh Nhu and President Diem. She was described as a sly woman who encroached upon her husband and "controlled" her brother-in-law the President.

Later, when I learned about the events of November 1-63 and the months that followed so I could conclude briefly: The Viet cong was ignorant, but they were not stupid. The Viet cong was ignorant but not lacking in arrogance. And up to now, almost half a century ago, many Nationals still won the long Vc succession. That's a pity!

Back to the story of Mrs. Ngo Dinh Nhu. Traditionally, the funeral of a Prime Minister's wife is often larger than the Prime Minister's funeral. Today, Counselor Ngo Dinh Nhu is no more, President Diem has fallen; and Ms. Nhu also passed away, this family no longer has any government or authority to be able to make those who express their admiration can "rely on" or "flatter" just like those who once enjoyed government bailout, who did not dare stand upright in front of the Wu family but later rebelled against them.

Through the events of 1-11-63, it was shown that the brothers of President Ngo Dinh Diem did not die at the hands of the enemies of the North Vietnamese communists, but they died under the guns of those who had enjoyed their fortune, good government of the Ngo family.

If I had to write a slander on the Ngo Dinh Diem government in a vengeance manner like the vile community and the Vietnamese did, I had a good reason, because Old Man Than I was once a victim of the secret agents of this regime. At that time,

because the North Vietnamese communist bandits could not annihilate Dad and his friends, they borrowed the hands of the Nationals to pay against the anti-communists.

- 1. The First Republic, such as President Ngo Dinh Diem, Mr. Advisor Ngo Dinh Nhu ... and those in this family who were killed in the November 1, 1963 coup, were truly patriotic people.
- 2. Mrs. Nhu, or Tran Le Xuan, when her husband died, she was very young. It was not difficult for her to take another step with her, but she chose to stay and worship her husband until the end of the world. As such, she also made many people respect.
- 3. Nearly 50 years of loneliness with silence is a spiritual power of Ms. Ngo Dinh Nhu that everyone needs to cherish.
- 4. Ms. Nhu is a courageous Representative of the First Republic. For example, at the time of 1959, polygamy was still prevalent, and she dared to introduce the bill to monogamy.
- 5. What the First Republic of Vietnam did, though only for a short time in 9 years; but brought a peaceful and prosperous life to South Vietnam. The stability of a society with many warlords left by the French helped to settle more than one million Communist refugees who migrated to the South and brought South Vietnam to a more powerful rank compared to other non-regional countries. anyone can do it.
- 6. Those who have criticized the Republic of Vietnam as dictatorship, corruption, religious repression, etc., please raise these issues with Vietnamese communist violence today. What the First Republic of Vietnam and Ms Nhu did, they don't need us to thank; But we need to say righteous things.

- 7. People really admire the woman named Tran Le Xuan, or counselor Ngo Dinh Nhu, because she is a Vietnamese woman who dares to speak and dare to do. She was a talented Representative, who founded the Youth Union of the Republic of Women to contribute to the construction of Vietnam at that time.
- 8. Although some people have never met Ms. Ngo Dinh Nhu, never been a god of the Ngo Dinh Diem regime, never received any favors and merits from them, they openly expressed their gratitude to with the First Republic of Vietnam has created for the people of the South a short time, but peaceful, full of warmth. This government effectively defended the people of the South, against the infamous invasion of the Northern communist aggressors.
- 9. By 1963, the one who had merit had to know that Diem was against the Kennedy administration's intention to bring American troops into Vietnam, so they fabricated specific "sins" of Uncle Ho and "crisis" and used her. Like a scapegoat, even though she was a woman, did not hold any official office in the government. Those things today are confirmed by declassified documents. So no matter who speaks the west, they still believe Ms. Nhu is a female patriot, moral, virtuous ... And they love her.
- 10. Particularly my comment (Huynh Quoc Binh): For more than half a century, Vietnamese people have been deceived by many Vcs, but the number of people who are ignorant about VCs is not small. I am not a Catholic, I or my family have never enjoyed any favors of the family of President Ngo Dinh Diem, except for the grace of the First Republic of Vietnam government that gave us years peace, freedom, prosperity and human rights are truly protected by that government. So I couldn't close my mouth to be alone and didn't dare speak out my independent comment...

Conclusion:

Ms. Tran Le Xuan, also known as Counselor Ngo Dinh Nhu, is a wonderful Vietnamese woman to me. A talented woman, well-educated, beautiful, and of course there are many temptations of life that have always awaited her, yet she has been secretly worshiping her husband according to Asian culture, without a curse to curse the killer of her husband, what if it was not a truly charitable and wonderful woman?

I believe that the souls of her and her husband, especially President Ngo Dinh Diem, were in Heaven even though their bodies were not perfect on earth.
